PHILADELPHIA – May 8, 2007 – In what can only be described as a welcomed rarity in the scrutinizing realm of AIA honors, two of KlingStubbins’ leaders were inducted as Fellows of the American Institute of Architects (FAIA) at last week’s AIA Convention in San Antonio, TX: Senior Principal and Director of Design Bradford White Fiske, FAIA, and Principal and Director of Corporate and Commercial Projects Richard J. Farley, FAIA, PE. Both gentlemen practice architecture at the firm’s Philadelphia headquarters.

Election to the FAIA is determined by the candidate’s ability to clearly establish himself or herself as exemplifying one of five areas of specialization defined by the Jury of Fellows. As part of the submission process, nominees are required to present reference letters and exhibits that thoroughly document his or her accomplishments.

Mr. Fiske demonstrated his ability “to promote the aesthetic, scientific, and practical efficiency of the profession through design,” definition of Fellowship category Object 1. Mr. Fiske was responsible for leading the designs for the award-winning Merck Research Laboratories in Boston, the Zhiye Plaza Office Tower in Suzhou, China, and the Bell Atlantic Tower, one of the most lauded skyscrapers in the Philadelphia skyline.

Richard J. Farley received his FAIA towards Fellowship category Object 2, “to advance the science and art of planning and building by advancing the standards of architectural education, training, and practice.” Mr. Farley has provided leadership as a principal of the firm on notable cutting edge projects for clients such as SAP America, the United States Postal Service, and Dow Jones and Company. His outstanding contributions as an Adjunct Associate Professor at the University of Pennsylvania warranted his FAIA elevation. Previous winner of the school’s Perkins Award for Excellence in Teaching, Mr. Farley teaches graduate courses in architectural structures and high-tech building enclosures.
